Nebraska Wesleyan University offers courses and special programs during the following summer sessions/terms:

Term = 08/R5

Miscellaneous Dates: May 21 – August 15, 2008

UNIQUE COURSE FORMATS.

Courses offered during summer may serve to meet general education or major requirements or may provide enriching elective experiences. Review the course schedule for each session to discover special offerings providing unusual educational opportunities or regular courses that may meet graduation requirements.

Although courses meet within a shortened timeframe, students should be aware that the number of contact hours and the expectations for outside preparation follow the same guidelines as courses offered during a regular semester.

CREDIT HOUR LIMITATIONS.

Because of the shortened timeframes of summer courses, registration is limited to twelve credit hours during summer school (combination of all summer sessions/terms) without special permission of the Executive Committee. See specific credit hour limits for each of the summer sessions. Auditing is not available during summer.

REGISTRATION.

Registration begins in conjunction with Fall pre-registration (April 16-25 according to classification and time assignment) and continues through the add deadlines for each session. Cancellation decisions will be made for Sessions I and II after May 2, based on enrollments at that time. Once you register it is your responsibility to drop your course(s) on Web Advisor or contact the Registrar's Office by the drop deadline if you need to cancel your registration.

Nebraska Wesleyan reserves the right to cancel any courses for insufficient enrollment. Classes enrolling fewer than six students may be canceled. Decision to cancel courses will be made after May 2 and posted on the bulletin board outside the Registrar's Office. Regular classes enrolling six or more students will be offered unless the course listing otherwise states a minimum.

COST/PAYMENT.

Summer school tuition is computed at the rate of \$215 per credit hour, except for applied music tuition, which is \$235 per credit hour. Certain studio art, science lab, and health and human performance activity classes have a course fee, which is listed in the course listing. Tuition does not include food, lodging, books, transportation, personal and miscellaneous expenses. Special fees and costs are in effect for some off-campus programs; see course descriptions for details.

Tuition and fees are due at the Business Office by the stated deadline on the next page. Some courses may require early payment for part or all of the fees. Deferred payments are not permitted for summer school courses. Accounts not paid by stated deadline will be assessed a \$40 late fee.

WITHDRAWAL AND REFUND POLICY.

The deadline to withdraw from a summer course varies – see the list of deadlines on the next page. Students who find it necessary, for any reason, to withdraw from summer classes receive refunds for tuition on a prorated basis (unrelated to dates affecting grades). Contact the Business Office for details about the refund policy.

HOUSING.

Campus housing is available for summer school students. Information may be obtained from the Residence Life Office. Food service is not available during the summer. A community kitchen is available for use in the residence hall, and there are restaurants in the nearby community.
