Clayton D. & Frances L. Feis Memorial Scholarship Award

A scholarship in memory of Professor Clayton Feis, former Chair of the Business Administration/Economics Department, is presented annually to a student in the economics or finance area.

The scholarship is in the amount of \$835.00 for the academic year. Scholarship recipients are selected each spring semester for the following year.

Applications are requested now for the awarding of this scholarship for the school year.

Eligibility

To be eligible for selection to receive this scholarship, students must meet the following criteria:

- 1) The student must be enrolled full-time at NWU and be a declared Economics major or minor or have an emphasis in Economics or Finance.
- 2) The student must have attained at least junior standing with a minimum of one full-time semester remaining before graduation.
- 3) The student must have completed at least 15 semester hours of economics and/or finance courses by the end of the semester in which the application is made.
- 4) Preference will be given to those who have faced significant difficulties and/or have significant financial need in achieving their educational goals.

Application Procedure and Deadline

All students who are interested in and eligible for the scholarship must submit the completed form and requested information to Rhonda Lakey SC240B **by May 1, 2020 at 5:00 p.m.**
