150-HOUR ACCOUNTING SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA

- Student must be an Accounting Major and meet the following criteria:
 - Be enrolled in a 150-hour program at a Nebraska college or university;
 - Be entering his/her final year in a 150-hour program;
 - Be currently enrolled in either the fall or spring semester of the upcoming school year (either semester is acceptable). However, the scholarship is forfeited if the student fails to attend EITHER the fall or the spring semester of the upcoming school year;
 - Plans to sit for the CPA exam;
 - Has the interest and capabilities of becoming a successful accountant; *and*
 - Is planning on spending the majority of his/her professional accounting career in Nebraska.

When candidates are reviewed, scholarship, personality, leadership and character will be considered by the instructional accounting staff at the college or university. Applicants are not required to have the highest grade point average.

Nominations for scholarship recipients are made by the college or university's Accounting Department faculty members and are approved by an Accounting Department Committee. If ratification by the Dean of the college is required, the nomination must come from the nominations of the Accounting Department.

Final selection of the scholarship recipients will be made by the Foundation of the Nebraska Society of CPAs' Board of Trustees. It is the college or university's responsibility to notify the student(s) awarded a scholarship.
