Our Bachelor of Science in Nursing program is designed to teach you the biological, sociological, and ethical aspects of health assessment on a local and global scale while developing your leadership and management skills in health care. Paired with our liberal arts education, you will become skilled in critical thinking, communication and problem solving.

This program is designed for current Registered Nurses with unencumbered nursing licenses. It is available in either Lincoln or Omaha.

BSN Admission Requirements:

- Completed prerequisite courses with C or better (see below)
- Diploma or Associate Degree in Nursing from a state-approved school with minimum 2.5 GPA
- Unencumbered active Nebraska, Iowa, or compact state nursing license with expiration date
- Successful completion of background check, drug screen, immunization tracker, and essential functions form

- The University Registrar and/or respective department chair at Nebraska Wesleyan will conduct a course-by-course evaluation of official transcripts to apply courses to general education, academic major, and degree requirements.
- Requirements and transfer equivalencies can change. An NWU admissions counselor can help determine transferability of credit.
- Prerequisite and nursing courses require grades of C or above to transfer, all other courses require C- or above to transfer. Courses with numbers below 1000 will not transfer.
- Students must complete a total of 126 semester hours to earn a bachelor's degree from NWU. A maximum of 64 credit hours can be transferred from CCC.
