



Nebraska Wesleyan University Transfer Guide for Central Community College Students RN to BSN program



Our Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) program is designed to teach you the biological, sociological, and ethical aspects of health assessment on a local and global scale while developing your leadership and management skills in health care. Paired with our liberal arts education, you will become skilled in critical thinking, communication and problem solving.

This guide will help you determine how courses for the Associate Degree Nursing (ADN) program at CCC will transfer to the BSN program at Nebraska Wesleyan University.

BSN Program Admission Requirements:

- Completed prerequisite courses with C or better (see below)
- Diploma or Associate Degree in Nursing from a state-approved school with minimum 2.5 GPA
- Unencumbered Nebraska, Iowa, or compact state nursing license with expiration date
- Successful completion of background check, drug screen, immunization tracker, and essential functions form

- The University Registrar at Nebraska Wesleyan will conduct a course-by-course evaluation of official transcripts to apply courses to general education, academic major, and degree requirements.
- Prerequisite and nursing courses require grades of C or above to transfer. All other courses require C- or better to transfer.
- A maximum of 64 credit hours can be transferred from CCC. Students must complete a total of 126 semester hours to earn a bachelor's degree from NWU.
- Required coursework can vary depending on a student's degree program, transferring credit, and other factors. Transfer equivalencies can change. Ask an NWU admissions counselor for details.
