Bachelor of Science in Social Work

Our curriculum is specially designed to give you the tools you need to master the philosophy and practice of social work. With NWU, you'll deepen your understanding by applying everything you've learned in a transformational field practicum experience in select social work agencies. NWU offers a Bachelor of Science in Social Work that is accredited by the Council on Social Work Education (CWSE).

This guide will help you determine which classes can be transferred from to NWU from CCC, and which courses must be taken after transferring to NWU. This major is available in both Lincoln and Omaha, and the requirements are the same for both the traditional and evening programs.

- The University Registrar at Nebraska Wesleyan will conduct a course-by-course evaluation of official transcripts to apply courses to general education, academic major, and degree requirements.
- Required coursework can vary based on students' degree program, transferring credit, and other factors. Requirements and transfer equivalencies can change. Ask an NWU admissions counselor for more information
- Courses must have a grade of C- or higher. Courses below 1000 will not transfer.
- A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher is required to take social work classes at NWU.
- A maximum of 64 credit hours can be transferred from CCC. Students must complete a total of 126 semester hours to earn a bachelor's degree from NWU.
