- Required coursework can vary based on students' degree program, transferring credit, and other factors. Transfer equivalencies can change. Ask your NWU admissions counselor for more information.
- The University Registrar and/or respective department chair at Nebraska Wesleyan will conduct a course-by-course evaluation of official transcripts to apply courses to general education, academic major, and degree requirements.
- Courses must have a grade of C- or higher to be eligible for transfer. Courses with numbers below 100 will not transfer.
- Students must complete a total of 126 semester hours to earn a bachelor's degree from NWU. A maximum of 64 credit hours can be transferred from IWCC.
