



General Education degree requirements

The Archway Curriculum is NWU’s nationally-recognized general education program. It is designed to enrich our students’ skills development within and beyond their majors throughout education.

This guide will help you determine which IWCC courses can transfer to NWU and meet general education requirements. It is designed for the student who is not ready to take classes in a specific degree program but plans to continue their education after IWCC. An NWU admissions counselor can help with choosing transferrable courses.

- Required coursework can vary depending on a student’s degree program, transferring credits, and other factors. Transfer equivalencies can change. Ask an admissions counselor for more information.
- The University Registrar and/or respective department chair at Nebraska Wesleyan will conduct a course-by-course evaluation of official transcripts to apply courses to general education, academic major, and degree requirements.
- Courses must have a grade of C- or higher to be considered for transfer, though some programs have additional requirements. See specific program requirements for more details. Courses with numbers below 100 will not transfer.
- Students must complete a total of 126 semester hours to earn a bachelor’s degree from NWU. A maximum of 64 credit hours can be transferred from IWCC.
