- The University Registrar and/or respective department chair at Nebraska Wesleyan will conduct a course-by-course evaluation of official transcripts to apply courses to academic major and degree requirements. Transfer equivalencies can change. Ask an admissions counselor for more information.
- HSV and HUM courses must have a C+ or higher to apply to the social work major. Other courses must have a grade of C- or higher to be eligible for transfer. Courses numbered below 100 will not transfer.
- A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher is required to take social work classes at NWU.
- Students must complete a total of 126 semester hours to earn a bachelor's degree from NWU. A maximum of 64 semester hours can be transferred from IWCC.
