

This program is for traditional undergraduates seeking a BSN in conjunction with an outstanding liberal arts education. Students are admitted to the program once a year, with classes starting in August. Admission to the nursing program is a competitive, holistic process with two applications:

- Step 1:** Apply for admission to NWU as a transfer student and provide official transcripts  
**Step 2:** Submit the BSN program application, available from **November 1-February 1** each year.

Admission requirements for the traditional BSN program are:

- Completion of prerequisite courses with grades of C or better (see table below)
- Satisfactory performance on Nursing Admission Exam (taken at NWU prior to admission)
- Cumulative college GPA of 3.0 or above
- CPR certification for Health Care Providers
- Completion of Certified Nurse Aid (CNA) course and listing on the state registry
- Two professional references submitted online
- Successful background check, drug screen, immunization tracker and essential functions form.

- The University Registrar will conduct a course-by-course evaluation of official transcripts to apply courses to general education, major, and degree requirements.
- Required coursework can vary based on students' degree program, transferring credit, and other factors. Requirements and transfer equivalencies can change. Ask your NWU admissions counselor for more information.
- Prerequisite and nursing courses require grades of C or above, all other courses require C- or above to transfer.
- A maximum of 64 credit hours can be transferred from IWCC. Students must complete a total of 126 semester hours to earn a bachelor's degree from NWU.
