- Required coursework can vary depending on a student's degree program, transferring credit, and other factors. Ask your admissions counselor for more information.
- The University Registrar and/or respective department chair at Nebraska Wesleyan will conduct a course-by-course evaluation of official transcripts to apply courses to general education, academic major, and degree requirements.
- Courses must have a grade of C- or higher to be eligible for transfer. Courses below 1000 will not transfer.
- Students must complete a total of 126 semester hours to earn a bachelor's degree from NWU. A maximum of 96 quarter hours/64 semester hours can be transferred from MCC.
- Requirements and transfer equivalencies can change. An admissions counselor can help determine transferability of credits.
