- Required coursework can vary depending on a student's degree program, transferring credits, and other factors. Transfer equivalencies can change. Ask your admissions counselor for more information.
- The University Registrar and/or respective department chair at Nebraska Wesleyan will conduct a course-by-course evaluation of official transcripts to apply courses to general education, academic major, and degree requirements.
- Courses must have a grade of C- or higher to be considered for transfer, though some programs have additional requirements. See specific program requirements for more details. Courses below 1000 will not transfer.
- Students must complete a total of 126 semester hours to earn a bachelor's degree from NWU. A maximum of 96 quarter credit hours/64 credit hours can be transferred from MCC.

NWU has designed the Archway Curriculum to enrich our students' skills development within and beyond their majors throughout their time at NWU.
