Bachelor of Science in Social Work

- The University Registrar and/or respective department chair at Nebraska Wesleyan will conduct a course-by-course evaluation of official transcripts to apply courses to general education, academic major, and degree requirements.
- Courses equivalent to social work courses/electives must have a grade of C+ or higher to count toward the degree. All other courses must have a grade of C- or higher to transfer. Courses with numbers below 1000 will not transfer.
- A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher is required to take social work classes at NWU.
- Students must complete a total of 126 semester hours to earn a bachelor's degree from NWU. A maximum of 96 quarter hours/64 semester hours can be transferred from MCC.
