- The University Registrar at Nebraska Wesleyan will conduct a course-by-course evaluation of official transcripts to apply courses to general education, academic major, and other degree requirements.
- Required coursework can vary based on students' degree program, transferring credit, and other factors. Requirements and transfer equivalencies can change. Ask your NWU admissions counselor for more information.
- Courses must have a grade of C- or higher to be eligible for transfer. Courses with numbers below 1000 will not transfer.
- A maximum of 64 credit hours can be transferred from community colleges. Students must complete a total of 126 semester hours to earn a bachelor's degree from NWU.
