The Archway Curriculum is NWU's nationally-recognized general education program. It is designed to enrich our students' skills development within and beyond their majors throughout education. Students must complete the requirements for both the Archway Curriculum, and must complete the requirements for at least one academic major.

- Required coursework can vary depending on a student's degree program, transferring credits, and other factors. Transfer equivalencies can change. Ask an NWU admissions counselor for more information.
- The University Registrar will conduct a course-by-course evaluation of official transcripts to apply courses to general education, academic major, and degree requirements.
- Courses must have a grade of C- or higher to be considered for transfer, though some programs have specific grade requirements. Courses with numbers below 1000 will not transfer.
- A maximum of 64 credit hours can be transferred from community colleges. Students must complete a total of 126 semester hours to earn a bachelor's degree from NWU.
