- Required coursework can vary based on students' degree program, transferring credit, and other factors. Transfer equivalencies can change. Ask your NWU admissions counselor for more information.
- The University Registrar at Nebraska Wesleyan will conduct a course-by-course evaluation of official transcripts to apply courses to general education, academic major, and degree requirements.
- SOCI 1130 must have a C+ or better to be eligible for transfer. Other courses must have a grade of C- or higher to transfer.
- A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher is required to take social work classes at NWU
- Students must complete a total of 126 semester hours to earn a bachelor's degree from NWU. A maximum of 64 credit hours can be transferred from MPCC.
