



## Nebraska Wesleyan University Transfer Guide for Mid-Plains Community College Students Traditional BSN program



This program is for traditional undergraduates seeking a BSN in conjunction with an outstanding liberal arts education. Students are admitted to the program once a year, with classes starting in August. Admission to the nursing program is a competitive, holistic process with two applications:

**Step 1:** Apply for admission to NWU as a transfer student and provide official transcripts

**Step 2:** Submit the BSN program application, available from **November 1-February 1** each year.

Admission requirements for the traditional BSN program are:

- Completion of prerequisite courses with grades of C or better (see table below)
- Satisfactory performance on Nursing Admission Exam (taken at NWU prior to admission)
- Cumulative college GPA of 3.0 or above
- CPR certification for Health Care Providers
- Completion of Certified Nurse Aid (CNA) course and listing on the state registry
- Two professional references submitted online
- Successful background check, drug screen, immunization tracker and essential functions form.

- The University Registrar will conduct a course-by-course evaluation of official transcripts to apply courses to general education, major, and degree requirements.
- Required coursework can vary based on students' degree program, transferring credit, and other factors. Requirements and transfer equivalencies can change. Ask an NWU admissions counselor for more information on transferability of credit.
- Prerequisite and nursing courses require grades of C or above, all other courses require C- or above to transfer.
- A maximum of 64 credit hours can be transferred from MPCC. Students must complete a total of 126 semester hours to earn a bachelor's degree from NWU.
