WHAT ARE SOMETHINGS TO CONSIDER BEFORE STUDYING ABROAD?

Housing

Are you interested in being more immersed in the culture? A homestay might be for you. Want to stay with other students? Maybe campus housing. When looking make sure to double-check what your program potentially offers! Some non-exchange programs and our sister schools may not provide housing and instead allow off-campus residency. Searching for your own accommodation can lead to some affordable options, so make sure you consider where you will live when you go abroad.

Food

Is food a driving force in your interest in a specific location? Similar to housing, some non-exchange programs and our sister schools (except for the University of Tartu) will not provide meals for you. Ask locals and your abroad university's study abroad office about where to shop for affordable food. Getting delivery every day might be expensive. So, you may want to be connected with local students and your host university study abroad office to learn about where to shop for affordable food or recipes.!

Traveling while Abroad

Want to get the fullest experience abroad? Consider all of your options when studying abroad. Other countries tend to have very nice and affordable public transportation systems, so look into buses and trains before getting your new friend to drive you across the country. Even plane tickets can be much more affordable in other countries. Within Europe, plane tickets can sell for around \$30 or \$40!
