#### UNL ACE Philosophy:

UNL refers to its general education requirements as the Achievement Centered Education (ACE). Faculty identified the ACE areas based in part on demands they heard from employers and graduate schools who sought candidates who can demonstrate these capabilities. The result was a cutting edge general education program that has been a model for several other institutions.

Employers hire students who can demonstrate these abilities and skills. The Association of American Colleges and Universities [published results of a survey \(2021\)](#) that demonstrates the importance of general education courses as a foundation for career success. More than 450 employers responded to the survey offering substantial reasons why students need to take general education courses and what they look for in candidates they hire.

Many Nebraska Wesleyan Honors Academy (WHA) courses transfer to UNL and fulfill the ACE requirements as follows:
