

Panhellenic Council Resolutions and Position Statements

We, the members of Nebraska Wesleyan University's Panhellenic Association, agree to uphold the following resolutions and position statements in an effort to advocate dignity, good manner and the Panhellenic spirit:

All Panhellenic sororities will strive to achieve the highest possible GPA by providing members with programs that promote effective study skills.

To promote an atmosphere of academic success and to maintain member's focus on their scholarly pursuits, chapter's are discouraged from hosting social activities on weeknights (Monday – Thursday).

The Panhellenic Council and its member chapters should avoid any programming during Culmination Week (dead week) and finals week in order to encourage academic success.

Before the start of the second semester, it is highly encouraged that all new members have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher.

The Panhellenic Council recommends that in order for new members to be eligible within specific chapters for an elected office position, they have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher.

The Panhellenic Council recommends that each chapter new member class meet a minimum cumulative grade point average of a 3.0 or higher.

The Panhellenic Council recommends that in order for a woman to be eligible for election to a chapter office, the woman must have a minimum cumulative grade point average equal to or higher than a 3.0.

All Panhellenic sororities shall strive to maintain a chapter grade point average for each semester of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale. In order for chapters to remain in good standing with the governing council, a chapter is highly encouraged to have a minimum cumulative grade point average equal to or higher than a 3.0.

The Panhellenic Council encourages all chapters to enforce a minimum GPA during term of office.

The Panhellenic Council discourages the use of alcohol and objects to the use of illegal substances by all Panhellenic sororities and its members.

The Panhellenic Council encourages chapters to enforce policies regarding alcohol, drugs, or other illegal substances from being present on any social media site through pictures, references, videos, ect.

Each year Panhellenic Council will host a fall and spring speaker to discuss current issues facing the Greek Community.

Panhellenic Council encourages members to participate in and support events hosted by Interfraternity Council and its member chapters.

Panhellenic Council member sororities will strive to maintain and promote positive relationships amongst each other.

Panhellenic Council will participate in the National Panhellenic Conference Month of the Scholar program every February.

At the beginning of each semester, delegates from each chapter will be required to gather the signatures of chapter women, reaffirming their support for the Nebraska Wesleyan University student honor code.

Panhellenic sororities will educate members on the risk management policies of their respective organization.

Panhellenic Council will not spend Panhellenic funds to purchase alcoholic beverages for any purposes nor will Panhellenic Council host any event in which alcohol will be present.

Panhellenic Council will host a faculty and staff appreciation day each fall and spring to maintain positive relations amongst fraternity and sorority members and university personnel.

Panhellenic Council and its member organizations will publicize events in a manner that positively promotes the Greek Community.

Panhellenic Council and its member organizations will strive to plan events that do not interfere with religious or cultural holidays.

Panhellenic Council promotes member rights to wear their badges at all times as symbols of pride in their membership and that they be encouraged to exercise that right.

Panhellenic Council and its member chapters will adhere to the Unanimous Agreements, Recruitment Guidelines and all amendments established by the National Panhellenic Conference and the Nebraska Wesleyan University Panhellenic Association.
